ARMENIAN, RUSSIAN, AZERBAIJANI PRESIDENTS MEET IN ST. PETERSBURG

Trilateral meeting between Armenian President Serzh Sargsyan, Russian President Dmitry Medvedev and Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev was held on June 17 in Konstantinov Palace, Saint Petersburg. Armenian presidential press service told Armenpress that the meeting started with participation of the three presidents, and then the foreign

ministers joined them. After the meeting Armenian Foreign Minister Edward Nalbandyan noted that the achievements gained through negotiations were registered at the meeting. An agreement was reached to continue the negotiations on the basis of those results. The presidents assigned the foreign ministers to continue the active negotiations.

Armenian President Serzh Sargsyan extended condolences to families of Azeri diversion victims. "I deeply commiserate with the families of 4 soldiers killed. We'll give our best efforts to make up for the irreparable loss suffered." As the President noted, he was informed about Azeri side's subversive attack on

June 18, right after the incident occurred. An Azeri recon element attempted to penetrate into Arstakh territory in the environs of Chaylu settlement, Mardakert region, on June 18, at 11.30 pm. As a result of retaliatory measures, the armed group was neutralized, leaving one dead and armament on the spot. The Armenian side lost 4 killed. 4 were injured.

Prior to meeting with President Saakashvili, the Foreign Minister presented perspectives of bilateral collaboration as well as priority tasks in RA foreign policy to Georgia's Armenian community, RA MFA press service reported.

10-15% GROWTH EXPECTED IN CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY IN 2010

A 10-15% growth will be fixed in construction industry in 2010 as compared with 2009, Armenian Minister of Urban Development said. "Despite the crisis, the construction industry tends to revive this year," Vardan Vardanyan said. He also informed that the Ministry negotiates new agreements with private investors. "A \$10-million agreement will be

concluded on implementation of a construction project in Yerevan," Vardanyan said. "There are projects which can't be accomplished due to financial problems. But if an enterprise submits a package of essential documents, the government can consider the application and render relevant assistance," he concluded.

As RA Prime Minister Tigran Sargsyan stated at National Youth Policy Board sitting, initial instalment amount, credit payment terms as well as interest rates required need reconsidering, governmental press service reported. Commenting on low number of applications submitted, the Prime Minister noted, "Banks were showing rather conservative attitude to the issue of crediting, given credit recurrence risks they will have to bear. Which means we have to pay special attention to crediting criterions to promote participation of youth in the program." "RA government is ready to increase financing as well as attract international donor organizations for successful program implementation," the Prime Minister stated.

1624 FAMILIES TO BE HOUSED IN 1988 EARTHQUAKE ZONE

Armenian Minister of Urban Development Vardan Vardanyan stated that 1624 families in the 1988 earthquake zone will be housed this year. "1056 families will receive apartments in Gyumri, 306 - in villages of Lori region, 220 - in Spitak, 42 - in Stepanavan," he said, adding that the issue is in the limelight of a relevant governmental commission. The Minister also noted that upon completion of construction works, specialists are invited to issue a conclusion on the seismic stability of the buildings. CO-PAYMENT SYSTEM TO BE INTRODUCED IN ARMENIAN MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS

Armenian Healthcare Ministry representative Ara Ter-Grigoryan, stated that the RA government has approved a pilot program envisaging introduction of the system of co-payments in a number of Armenian medical institutions, starting with Arabkir medical center.

"The program will last 6 months and will first of all refer to people who undergo treatment by government order," he said. "A part of the sum will be paid by the government, the remaining part - by the client. The project has two goals: to determine the real amount of payments in the hospitals and avoid secret bargains. It will first be launched in Yerevan and then in regions of Armenia," he said, adding that the payment system in maternity hospitals and polyclinics will remain unchangeable.

The Ministry will conduct monthly monitoring to decide whether the project should be prolonged.

YEREVAN TO HOST NATO DISASTER RESPONSE EXERCISE IN SEPT. 2010

Armenia attaches importance to cooperation with NATO, both for development of political dialogue and implementation of defense reform, Armenian Deputy Foreign Minister said. "Starting with 1990-ies, Armenia-NATO cooperation has undergone a number of stages. Ensuring sustainable development, we collaborate in the framework of IPAP, interact to combat terrorism and proliferation of weapons of mass destruction," Arman Kirakossian said during the seminar on Improving Public Perceptions on NATO

Operations and Security/Defense Sector Reform.

"Realizing the significance of responding to challenges, Armenia participates in peacekeeping operations in Afghanistan and will continue contributing to international security," he said.

The Deputy Foreign Minister also informed that Yerevan will host Disaster Response Exercise in September 2010, bringing together experts and representatives of state agencies from over 50 countries.

TIGRAN SARGSYAN PARTICIPATES IN THE SCIENTIFIC-RESEARCH WORKSHOP RELATED TO THE WATER SPHERE POLICY



rmenian Prime Minister Tigran Sarg-Asyan participated on June 16 in a scientific-research workshop related to the water sphere policy. Governmental press service told Armenpress that the goal of the workshop is to present the medial results of the sphere reforms initiated by the government and discuss the challenges relating to the water sphere policy. Representatives of the sphere's state and private sector, international donor financial establishments, experts participated in the event. Armenian government asked the World Bank to work out a document on "Water Sphere Policy", analyzing the situation of the sphere, the experience of state-private activity in Armenia, lessons picked up from the international practice. Welcoming the participants of the workshop Prime Minister Tigran Sargsyan said in his speech that in the implementation of economic reforms Armenia reached a new harbor. "It is necessary to specify a number of basic issues which we have revealed and asked the World Bank to provide consultation. Particularly, it has been spoken about strategy of organization of drinking water supply". The prime minister said also that the reforms are quite positive, noting that the results of drinking water supply are impressive. Referring to the implementation of capital investments in the communities and equal territorial development the prime minister said that during the recent years a great attention has been paid to the sphere and investments have been made and will continue to be made for upgrading the infrastructures. At the end of the meeting the head of the government thanked all the organizations which during this period of time tried to assist in the organization of water supply works. On the basis of the results of workshop and conclusions suggestions about water sphere policy will be summed up and will be presented at the next workshop which is scheduled for autumn.

FOUR ARMENIANS AND ONE AZERI KILLED IN KARABAKH CLASH

Ckirmishes, sometimes fatal, erupt fre-Quently along front lines near Nagorno-Karabakh, a small mountainous region under the control of ethnic Armenians who fought a six-year separatist war with support from neighboring Armenia. The ethnic-Armenian controlled military said in a statement its soldiers repelled an Azeri attack late Friday, in which four ethnic Armenian soldiers were killed and four wounded. In Baku, Azerbaijan's Defense Ministry confirmed a clash took place and an Azeri soldier was killed. An estimated 30,000 people were killed and 1 million displaced before a ceasefire in 1994 but a peace accord has never been agreed and the ethnic Armenian leadership's independence claim has not been recognized by any country.

Armenia's central bank states that in 2010 the country's economy will grow by a minimum of 3-4%.

Industry will grow 5-7%, construction 1-3%, services 2.5-4.5%, agriculture 2-4%. It should be mentioned that Armenian GDP increased by 7.2% in the first four months of 2010 compared to January-April 2009.

It can therefore be said that Armenia has overcome the consequences of the world economic crisis, despite the blockade.

To historians, Armenia is a borderland between East and West, on which the tide of cultural division has washed back and forth since the days of Rome and Persia. To theologians, the country is a window through time; this oldest national church is a witness to a Christian tradition both ancient and unique. To students of early-Christian history, it's both. Since Ani's heyday in the 10th and 11th centuries, Seljuk, Georgian, Mongol and Timurid armies have breached its walls.

NATO WEEK STARTS IN ARMENIA



NATO week started in Armenia, the Acountry's Foreign Ministry said in a statementJune14, according to RIA Novosti. "The NATO week is one of the most important events held in Armenia this year. It is aimed at familiarizing Armenian society with the key activities of the North Atlantic alliance," the ministry said. NATO representatives are expected in Armenia. Meetings and other events, including video conferences and international seminars, are on the agenda. The NATO week will be held in Armenia for a fourth time. It will last until June 18. Cooperation between Armenia and NATO develops in line with an Individual Partnership Action Plan signed in December 2005. The plan envisions security consultations with NATO, developing Armenia's military doctrine, and improving the country's defense budget planning. Armenia participates in NATO's peace keeping missions in Kosovo and Afghanistan.

OSCE TO MONITOR CONTACT LINE BETWEEN ARMENIAN, AZERBAIJA-NI TROOPS AT KARABAKH BORDER

group of OSCE representatives will monitor on Wednesday the contact line between Armenian and Azerbaijani troops at the border between the two countries, the Armenian Defense Ministry's press service has said. The monitoring will reportedly be held in line with the mandate granted to Kazakh Secretary of State Kanat Saudabayev's envoy to the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe. Kazakhstan currently holds the rotating chair of the OSCE. The monitoring will take place near the village of Bardzruni in Armenia's Vayots Dzor province, at the border with the disputed Nagorny Karabakh region.Armenia and Azerbaijan frequently accuse each other of violating the ceasefire agreement in the disputed area.
