ARMENIA BECOMES BOARD MEMBER OF INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION FOR STANDARDIZATION

irector of the RA National Institute of Standards Enok Azaryan said that in July Armenia has been elected a board member of the International Organization for Standardization (ISO). Over 50 countries voted for Armenia's membership in the ISO board, Azaryan told a press conference in Yerevan. "The common methodology of standardization will allow Armenian entrepreneurs to avoid problems with export of their products. All issues related to commerce and trade turnover in 162 countries included in the ISO will be solved through common standardization," he said. Azaryan noted that standardization is carried out on a voluntary basis - at the option of producer. But a company will not be able to enter the European market without standardization. In case of violation of standardization and compliance rules, fines are envisaged at the amount of AMD 100,000-

YOUTH FORUM ON ARMENIA-DIASPORA ISSUES KICKS OFF IN YEREVAN

Atwo-day youth forum on Armenia-Diaspora issues kicked off in Yerevan. Participants of the forum, basically represented by interns of the Armenian Center for Strategic and International Studies, will deliver reports on cooperation, as well as will present opportunities for expanding and boosting ties in various fields between the Fatherland and Diaspora. *August 5, 2010 www.panarmenian.net* 300,000. The Ministry of Agriculture and the Service for Protection of Consumers' Rights carry out inspections on compliance of foodstuffs and non-foods with standards respectively. According to Azaryan, around 20,000 people apply for standardization per year. Meanwhile, the cost of certificate varies from AMD 1.5-3.5mln, depending on type and scope of activity. Certificates are issued for three years. In addition, Azaryan said that the RA National Institute of Standards was awarded an ISO special prize in Tbilisi on July 27. The ISO was established in 1946 by five national organizations for standardization. Currently, the ISO comprises of 162 member states, out of which 105 states are full members of the organization. RA GOVERNMENT HOSTS SIT-TING OF GOVERNING COUN-CIL OF INVESTMENT PRO-GRAM ON NORTH-SOUTH ROAD CORRIDOR

AROUND 11,500 APPLI-CANTS ENTERED HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS OF ARMENIA IN 2010

n August 4, the RA Ministry of Education and Science hosted a sitting of the State Admission Commission to discuss appropriation of target seats to the Republic of Artsakh and establishment of the nominal lists of paid and free seats of state higher education institutions of Armenia. RA Minister of Education and Science, Chairman of the State Admission Commission Armen Ashotyan said that, as per decision of the RA government, 70 seats were appropriated to the Republic of Artsakh in 2010 that is 10 seats higher as compared with last year. 16 applicants from the Republic of Artsakh have entered higher education institutions through taking exams in institutions, while 44 applicants – through taking joint entrance exams. Ten additional seats were appropriated to the RA Police Academy.

ARMENIA-RUSSIA PROD-UCT TURNOVER GROWS BY 13,4% IN JANUARY-JUNE 2010

Armenia-Russia product turnover grew by 13,4% in January-July 2010, compared to the same period in 2009 to comprise USD 447 million, with Russia's share grossing 20,6% out of total RA foreign trade turnover.

Armenia to Russia exports comprised USD 57,1 million, increasing by 39,3%, with imports totaling USD 389,9 million (10,4% increase).

Foreign trade turnover volume totaled USD 2166,8 million in January-June 2010, increasing 29,8% compared with 2009 results. Total exports comprised USD 442,8 million (55,9% growth), imports grossed USD 1724 million (24,4% increase), RA National Statistic Service reported.

PROPATRIA ARMENIA IN THE CONSTRUC-TION OF SOUTH-NORTH TRANSPORT CORRIDOR

rmenia's PM Tigran Sarksyan re-Acently chaired another meeting of the South-North investment programme management board. This time the meeting was dedicated to the ecological problems associated with the construction of this transport corridor. The adopted document would be aired in Armenia for public discussion. In December this year, Armenia and the Asian Development Bank plan to sign a credit agreement for financing the construction of the highway from the Armenian town of Megri at the Iranian border towards the Georgian Black Sea ports of Poti and Batumi. They estimate the total cost of the project will reach USD 1 billion. Companies from Italy, Brazil and Iran have expressed their interest to participate in the project. The motorway will be of particular interest to Iran, which will then have access to the Black Sea and onward to European countries through this connection.

BASE TO STAY IN ARMENIA



Armenia will allow Russia to extend its lease on a military base in the city of Gyumri because the base contributes to the country's security, Armenian Security Council chief Artur Bagdasaryan said Thursday. Bagdasaryan said the 25-year lease, which was signed in 1995, might be extended to 49 years or even more, the Novosti-Armenia web site reported.

He did not say when the new agreement might be signed, but an unidentified diplomatic source told Arminfo. info that it might happen during President Dmitry Medvedev's visit to Armenia later this month.

IRAN, ARMENIA STRESS EXPANSION OF ECONOMIC COOPERATION

TEHRAN (FNA)- Iranian Foreign Minister Manouchehr Mottaki and Armenian Deputy Foreign Minister in a meeting in Tehran explored avenues for developing mutual cooperation between the two countries. During the meeting on Tuesday, the two sides also underlined development of regional cooperation and continuation of talks and consultations on issues of mutual interest. Mottaki emphasized the importance of developing infrastructural relations between the two countries in such fields as transportation, energy, power plant, pipeline and railroad construction.

During the meeting, Armenian Deputy Foreign Minister Arman Kirakosian strengthening the political consultations between the two countries, and called for an increase in economic cooperation and trade exchanges between the two sides.

Describing Iran's role in the region as positive, he said that Tehran enjoys a significant position in the region and in regional developments.

Iran and Armenia have accelerated expansion of their bilateral relations in recent years, specially in political, economic, trade and cultural fields.

Iran in early February held an international conference in Tehran on trade and investment opportunities in Armenia, where Armenian and Iranian officials both expressed the hope that the relations between the two countries would further develop.

During the conference, Iran's Deputy Foreign Minister Amir Mansour Borqe'i called on Iranian and Armenian officials to use all the existing potentials and capabilities to increase trade ties and exchanges between the two countries.

"Iran and Armenia should use all the existing potentials to expand trade activities and mutual investment by the (two countries') private sector," Borqe'i said at the conference.

Also, Senior Advisor to Armenian President Ahram Narsisian reiterated during the same conference that Yerevan is seeking to promote relations with Iran. *August 4, 2010 www. english.farsnews.com*

ARMENIAN AMERICANS SUE TURKEY, BANKS OVER GENOCIDE LOSSES

awyers who have helped secure multimillion dollar settlements over Genocide-era insurance policies have launched an unprecedented lawsuit against the Turkish government and banks, Associated Press reported. In paperwork filed July 29, Los Angeles lawyers Mark Geragos and Brian Kabateck are seeking class-action status for the suit that would compensate descendants of victims of the Armenian Genocide for financial and property losses they suffered. Original plaintiffs include Garbis Davoyan of Glendale, Calif. and Hrayr Turabian of Queens, N.Y., and others are expected to join the suit that charges breach of statutory trust, unjust enrichment, human rights violations and violations of international law as the Turkish government expelled its Armenian citizens and ceased their properties.

DEFENDANTS

Turkey's government along with its Central Bank and Ziraat (Agriculture) Bank, Turkey's biggest bank, are named as defendants. Ziraat Bank was established in 1863 and operated continuously since. It currently has assets of more than \$81 billion and branches in Moscow and throughout Central Asia. Established in 1931, Turkey's Central Bank took over central banking operations from the Ottoman Bank which itself was established in 1856. Since 1930s, the Ottoman Bank operated as a private bank until it was incorporated into Garanti Bank, currently Turkey's second largest bank with \$78 billion in assets.

A LONG PROCESS

The suit designation may take up to three years, Mr. Kabateck told AP. "We are rolling up our sleeves and are going forward," he said. Turkish officials have not yet reacted to the lawsuit. In 2000, California state law allowed heirs to Genocide victims to seek payment on uncollected life insurance policies of dead relatives. opening the way to lawsuits. In 2004 and 2005, New York Life Insurance Co. and French insurer AXA settled for a total of \$37.5 million paid to Armenian community organizations. But in 2009, as it weighed another insurance case against several German insurers, the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals invalidated the state law on the grounds that it interfered with U.S. foreign policy.
