RUSSIAN PRESIDENT DMITRY MEDVEDEV'S FIRST STATE
VISIT IN ARMENIA

ussian President Dmitry Medvedevarrived in Armenia on a state visit on August 19 evening. It was the first ever state visit in the hisof Armenian-Russian relations. tory The Russian President started his viswith attending the Armenian Genocide Memorial. Then he was welcomed in his Armenian counterpart's residence. On Friday, August 20, official talks was followed by signing of documents and a joint press conference of Dmitry Medvedev and Serzh Sargsyan. On the same day, the President took part in the opening ceremony of the Hill of Honor in Gyumri. Upon completion of the state visit, Dmitry Medvedev attended the informal summit of leaders of the Collective Security Treaty Organization. On August 19 evening, Armenian and Russian Presidents as well as their wives walked in the Republic Square, where the everyday program of Singing Fountains was replaced by Russian composers' Serzh Sargsyan and Dmitry Medvedev also had a talk with Yerevan residents passing by and then visited a cafn in the center of the city. During a

reception in the Armenian President's residence, Russian leader Dmitry Medvedev thanked his Armenian counterpart Serzh Sargsyan for warm welcome. "Our relations date back centuries, indeed. And what's important, our nations traditionally supported each other at the most dramatic historical junctures. There are many examples to prove it," President Medvedev noted. He also said that Armenia was among the first countries to reach a helping hand to Russia during the recent forest fires, bringing great deal of moral and material support. "Russian-Armenian relations, bilateral as well as in the framework of the CSTO and CIS, are really very close. They can be called exemplary in every respect. Our dialogue is mutually beneficial, both at the personal and regional levels, which is important and commendable," Medvedev said. "I would like to personally thank the leadership of Armenia, all our counterparts for strengthening our relations, for their sincere will to develop our partnership and expand ties. This state visit is a symbol of that very partnership."

TIGRAN SARGSYAN SAYS ARMENIA TO HAVE BRIGHT FUTURE IF TTO-DAY'S HERO IS THE EDUCATED AND INTELLECTUAL YOUNG



RA Prime Minister Tigran Sargsyan par took on August 23 in the opening ceremony of 'Baze 2010' youth gathering, organized in Tsakhkadzor by the Armenian Youth Foundation. More than 280 young people from Armenia, Artsakh and Javakhk were invited to the youth gathering. SERGEI LAVROV: RUSSIA WILL NEVER SUPPLY ARMS IF DESTABILIZATION THREAT EMERGES

Russia will never supply arms if destabilization threat emerges, Russian Foreign Minister said.

"Purchase of S-300 by a country causes panic about possible destabilization. As a matter of fact, S-300 is a defense system which is deployed in compliance with international norms," Sergei Lavrov said in an interview with Public Armenian Television, when commenting on reports on possible sale of S-300 to Azerbaijan.

"S-300 is meant to defend the territory from missile attacks. I am confident that no country in the region we are speaking about is planning to unleash



war. I was personally present at the meeting between Presidents of Russia, Armenia and Azerbaijan, who signed documents excluding use of force for resolution of the Karabakh conflict," he said.

ARMENIA, RUSSIA MAP OUT NEW COOPERATION PLANS



A joint statement was adopted upon completion of the Russian President Dmitry Medvedev's visit to Armenia.

"The current condition and prospects of Armenian-Russian strategic partnership were discussed during the talks. The parties exchanged views on the most urgent regional and international issues. They also expressed willingness to further constructive bilateral collaboration in the framework of CSTO and CIS as well as within international organizations, including the UN and OSCE," the statement says.

It goes on saying, "Russian President Dmitry Medvedev's initiative for development and conclusion of European security pact met with approval from the President of Armenia, Serzh Sargsyan... Besides, the Republic of Armenia and the Russian Federation confirmed commitment to soonest resolution of the Nagorno Karabakh conflict through peaceful and acceptable for both sides means. They also stressed the importance of non-use of force, territorial integrity and the right of nations to self-determination as the basic principles which are mentioned in the latest statement issued by the OSCE Minsk Group."

"Special attention was paid to the activity of intergovernmental committee on economic cooperation... Another important component of Armenian-Russian allied relations is political and military cooperation," the statement reads. "The Presidents of Armenia and Rus sia are confident that the current stage of relations offers wide opportunities for further development and strengthening of ties for the glory of the nations as well as for peace and stability in the Caucasus and in the entire world."

RUSSIA TO PROLONG MILI-TARY PRESENCE IN ARMENIA

Armenia said on Wednesday it had agreed to extend the lease on a Russian military base in the South Caucasus country until 2044, strengthening Moscow's military presence in the strategic region. The deal will be signed during a visit to Yerevan by Russian President Dmitry Medvedev on Thursday and Friday. Armenian Foreign Minister Edward Nalbandian confirmed the lease extension in an interview with Rossiya-24 television.

It will prolong for decades Russia's military presence in Armenia, its chief strategic and economic ally in a region criss-crossed by pipelines carrying Central Asian and Caspian oil and gas to Europe. The Russian military also has troops in two breakaway regions of neighbouring Georgia, where it is building up bases in the wake of a five-day war over rebel South Ossetia in 2008. Russia and Armenia signed a deal in 1995 allowing the Russian base in the town of Gyumri on Armenia's closed western border with Turkey to operate for 25 years. Nalbandian said the changes would extend that deal to 49 years from 1995. He said the deal would spell out that the Russian base would help secure the landlocked country of 3.2 million people, where the spectre of renewed conflict with oil-producing Azerbaijan over rebel Nagorno-Karabakh is never far away. "And in realising those goals, the Russian side will assist in providing Armenia with weapons and modern military equipment," Nalbandian said. Some in the Armenian opposition have complained the deal undermines the country's independence. Russia has several thousand soldiers in Gyumri, who help patrol Armenia's western border with NATO-member Turkey. Ankara closed the frontier in 1993 in solidarity with close Muslim ally Azerbaijan during the war over Nagorno-Karabakh. The mountain region threw off Azeri rule in the early 1990s with Armenian backing.

MEDVEDEV, SARGSYAN TO DISCUSS RUSSIA'S INVESTMENT IN ARMENIA



ussian President Dmitry Medvedev Kand his Armenian counterpart Serzh Sargsyan will discuss the implementation of Russia's investment projects in Armenia, including nuclear cooperation between the countries, during Medvedev's visit to Yerevan. The Russian president arrived in Armenia on a state visit on Thursday. "Nuclear energy is one of the most promising spheres [of cooperation]. An intergovernmental agreement on cooperation in the construction of a new generation nuclear power unit in Armenia is being prepared for signing during the visit," the Kremlin said in a statement issued ahead of Medvedev's visit. Armenia plans to begin building the new nuclear power unit, with a capacity of 1000WT, in 2011. The cost of the project could reach \$5 billion. The unit is expected to be operational by 2017, when the unit currently in service will be shut down. A joint Russian-Armenian enterprise has been created to conduct research to find out if Armenia has any uranium reserves. According to expert estimates, the country could possess between 30,000 and 60,000 metric tons of recoverable uranium. Russia has invested a total of \$2,4 billion in Armenia's economy since 1991, which accounts for about 60 percent of all foreign investment in the country. Energy, banking, telecommunication, metallurgy and construction are the main spheres of Russia's investment. August 20, 2010 www.en.rian.ru

RUSSIA SIGNS DEAL TO GUARANTEE ARMENIA'S SECURITY

Russia and Armenia have signed a deal which will keep Russian troops in the former Soviet republic for years to come.

Russian President Dmitry Medvedev and his Armenian counterpart Serzh Sarkisian sealed the agreement in the Armenian capital Yerevan.

Moscow is to extend its lease on a military base in Armenia from 2020 to 2044 while reinforcing the garrison of 3,000 Russian troops stationed there to guarantee Armenia's security.

The pact is likely to set alarm bells ringing in neighbouring Azerbaijan which is locked in a conflict with Yerevan over the breakaway Nagorny Karabakh region.

Georgia – which fought a brief war with Russia two years ago – is equally unlikey to welcome the arrangement which bolsters Moscow's military clout in the South Caucasus.

ARMENIA TO EXTEND GYUMRI BASE LEASE FOR 49 YEARS



Russia and Armenia are planning to sign a protocol to extend the lease of the Russian military base at Gyumri for 49 years.

The document may be signed during President Dmitry Medvedev's visit to Yerevan, Armenian Foreign Minister Edward Nalbandian has told reporters. The 1995 25-year lease agreement will be prolonged for another 49 years, he said

Russia will provide assistance in modernizing the Armenian Armed Forces, Edward Nalbandian said.
